



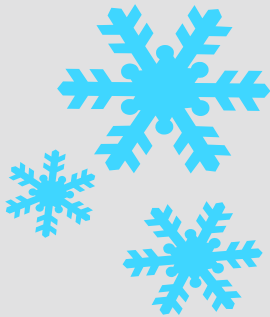

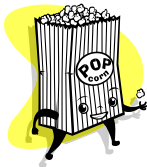

## Third Grade News

Happy New Year!!!

It may feel cold outside, but we are nice and cozy since we headed to the warm weather in Australia. While in Australia, we will learn about the Aborigines, the unique animals that inhabit this great land, and **some Aussie slang. We will also take a tour of the "Outback" and check out the Great Barrier Reef, as well as Ayers Rock.**

In math, the students are working very hard on our multiplication unit. They have been introduced to all their basic facts and have been taught strategies to solve these problems. We will continue to visit multiplication throughout the school year. Students will take weekly timed multiplication tests and chart their progress. It will be important that kids master their facts by the end of third grade. As always, keep practicing basic math facts (addition, subtraction and multiplication) with your son or daughter.

In Science, we are working on a unit about Matter. The students have been having a lot of fun exploring all the aspects of matter!! This unit has many hands-on projects. Our next unit will be focusing on the **Sun and the Moon. Students will learn about the earth's rotation and revolution. The children will learn about the seasons and why they occur.**

During LA Block, we are continuing the process of formulating a paragraph. We will continue to work on topic sentences, details, and writing a conclusion. We will continue to use the basal readers to learn other comprehension strategies. In addition, we will use different trade books that focus on different genres. Please continue to read with your child each night to help with comprehension and fluency.

The Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake school district is proud to offer a "School News Notifier" (SNN) service to all interested individuals. This is an opt-in alert system -- which means that YOU control which of our 8 alerts you want to receive. Users can subscribe or unsubscribe to receive e-mails about any of the following topics:

- Emergency school closings and delays:** Find out via e-mail when any of our five schools is closed unexpectedly due to severe weather or other emergency. Alerts will also go out when classes are on a one-hour or two-hour delay in the morning, or when all after-school or evening activities are cancelled due to bad weather.
- Board of Education Budget Development:** Sign up for this notification if you are interested in following the process of creating the next school budget.
- Change in Sex Offender Residency:** Find out via e-mail whenever our school district is notified by the police that a registered sex offender has moved into or changed residency in our district. This is a rare occurrence, but signing up for this alert will allow you to share whatever limited information we receive from the police.

You can also sign up to receive alerts on news, events and activities specific to any of our five schools.

**PLUS Text Message:**  
By providing your cell phone number and cellular carrier, you can also receive Emergency School Closing alerts on your cell phone as a text message.

**How do I sign up for SNN?**  
Simply visit the district website at [www.bhbl.org](http://www.bhbl.org) and click on the large "SNN" School News Notifier logo. You will find answers to **Frequently Asked Questions** and a place to set your personal options, including your e-mail address(es), desired password and desired alerts.

Important note: SNN is a secure system. The school district cannot see your password, and we will NOT share your e-mail address with anyone.

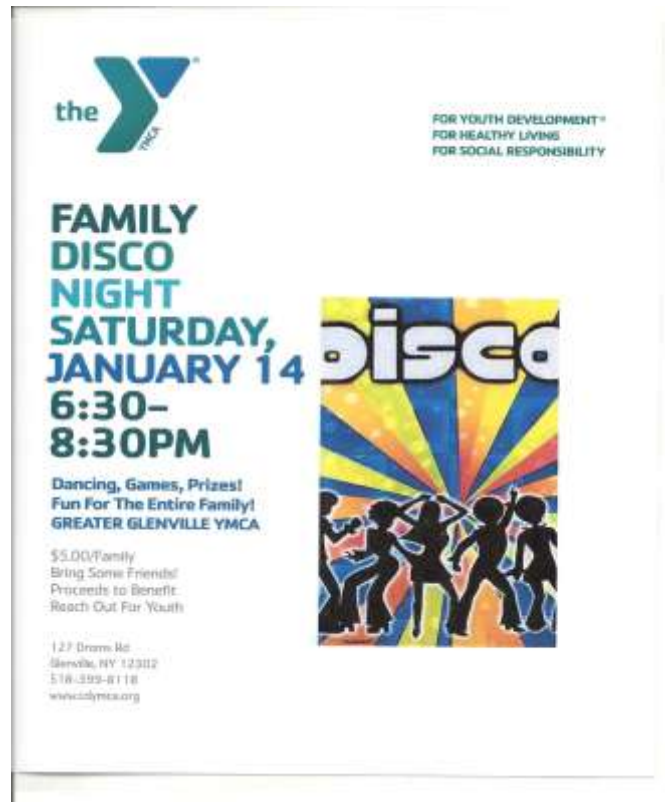

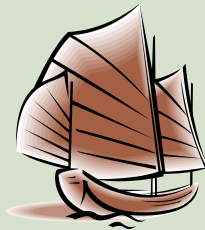
